Annelies George was born in Bussum and writes in her spare time. For years she has been working in the (international) business world in various (international) management positions. Despite her busy agenda, she tries to find time to put her thoughts on various topics on paper. In 2017 she came into contact with an American coach, who as a former agent could teach her a lot about the American

publishing world. On his advice, she left for a writer's conference in Los Angeles where she brought the Jessie Golden Earth series to the attention of agents and publishers. However, caring for her mother (Alzheimer's) prevented her from traveling to America on a regular basis, which influenced her choice of publisher. In addition to the "Jessie Golden Earth series" and Nice Doing Business with You, Ma'am," she has written a spiritual book "Learn to Understand your Original Self" that has not yet been published. A book about her experience as a family caregiver and the debilitating Alzheimer's disease, among others, is still on her agenda.
